...HELMET HINTS...

Over time and use, the snap fasteners on your helmet may have loosened. Use a pair of pliers to re-crimp the edges of the dome fastener, as shown in the photos.



Chin Strap - once you have adjusted the buckle length to suit, you only need to use the dome fasteners for doing up/undoing the chin strap. If the chin strap is too long for you, look at your chin strap until you find a row of stitching shaped in a 'V' (there are several of these rows stitched onto the chin straps). Cut the strap in front of the applicable 'V' stitching line to suit you.
